Fidgets are a very controversial topic – they're amazing for people who struggle with attention, sensory processing and emotional regulation, but they can end up being misused and becoming a distraction to all in the immediate area. It's vital that children have the right tools to meet their needs and know how to use them effectively. What works for one child might not work for the next.

If your child struggles with attention, sensory processing and/or emotional regulation, spend some time talking about what their needs are and when they need something to help. Are there certain times of day or particular lessons? Do they struggle more during the teacher input or when they need to work independently? Identify times that a fidget might help.

Establish the difference between a fidget and a toy. A fidget is a tool to meet a need and a toy is for fun. In fact, try to avoid the term 'fidget toy' because this confuses the matter – 'fidget tool' is far better. This video explains it perfectly:

Explore different options with them, taking time to see what works best for them. Do they need something to bend, twist, squish, pull, snap, pop, chew or spin? Do they prefer a certain texture or movement? Is this meeting their need or do they just enjoy it? This helps to distinguish between a tool and a toy.

## Set the rules for using the fidget:

- 1. Only use it to help with concentrating, or regulating their emotions or senses2. Use it discretely so that it doesn't distract others (or themselves)
- 3. If they play with it, they lose it until they can prove they can use it appropriately 4. When they're done with the fidget, put it back where it belongs for safe keeping
- If you feel your child needs a fidget tool, talk to their teacher to make sure you're all in agreement and establish rules and expectations for use. If children bring in objects that haven't been agreed with teachers or another member of staff, we will remove it and give it back at the end of the day. This is to prevent toys being brought in under the guise of 'needing a fidget'. We are happy to provide fidgets but where necessary, things from home may be brought in with agreement with the teacher.
