Our reception children had a picnic on the field on Thursday with their parents to celebrate their time in reception, it is hard to believe they will be in Y1 in September!

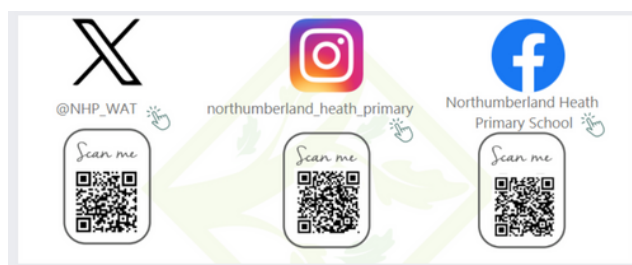

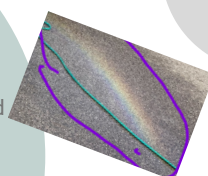

Year Three

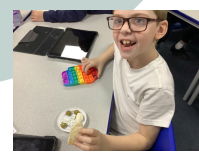
