This week Saplings have been exploring letters, postcards and stamps linking to our core text The Jolly Postman. We have used the text for a range of writing and reading opportunities and have each made our very own stamp.

This half term in DT Year 1 are looking at freestanding structures. This week we explored making our own freestanding structures from different construction kits. The biggest challenge the children found was ensuring it was able to stand on its own







Year One

This week in maths, Year 2 have been learning how to subtract by crossing ten. The children have been using dienes to solve subtraction problems by exchanging one group of ten for ten ones, in order for them to subtract the correct amount of ones, to solve the subtraction problem.

This week in English, the children met the main character of our book, The Iron Man. They took part in a "Conscience Alley" activity, with one side seeing him as a hero and the other as a threat. This helped them develop listening and speaking skills as they explained and justified their opinions to each other. It was a wonderful way to engage them in critical thinking and respectful discussion!

Last week Year 4 explored the meaning of area in maths and used different strategies to work out the area of 2D shapes. We also had a great day immersing ourselves in our topic of Ancient Egyptians, wrote our names in hieroglyphs, played charades by acting out different roles of Egyptians and explored properties of pyramids by creating models using spaghetti and marshmallows. The children gathered everything they had learned and created lovely keynote presentations.









This week in Year 5, we used the glockenspiel to compose their jazz music.

We explored the different notes of each sound and worked together to ensure everyone's sound flowed. We mainly used the notes G,A and B

This week Year 6 have been lucky enough to have a visit from TfL to give them advice on the best way to travel when they begin to travel independently. They had an excellent time learning about this. They have been learning about light and how it travels in straight lines.
