On Thursday, we celebrated our stars of the week, golden book children and the class with the highest attendance. Well done to all those who we celebrated!










If you go down in the woods today, what will you find? Reception children looking for worms and treasure! We have had a lovely first session, enjoying our outdoor woods!

Year Three










Sign of the Week
