#### Exploring the Art of Paul Klee

This week Nursery have been really working hard on their fine motor skills. We have been enjoying strengthening our fingers and hands

during our Dough Disco sessions every day. Why not practice at

home too? We have been learning how to use scissors safely. Thumb at top, elbow in and move the paper not the scissors. We now know how to hold scissors safely when we are not using them.

This week in Year 2, we've been diving into the world of the famous artist Paul Klee! The children were surprised to learn that Klee himself was often disappointed with his artistic abilities, which inspired us to get creative and try new things in our own artwork. We created a visual fact file about Klee and explored his iconic painting Castle and Sun. The way he used geometric shapes and primary colours really caught our eye, and we had fun experimenting with similar techniques. Our favourite takeaway from Klee's work is his playful quote, "A line is just a dot that went for a walk." It really made us think about how we can turn simple ideas into amazing art. What fun we had!

This week, Year 3 Mountain Ash showed their love for reading with exciting activities! They visited the local library to explore books and borrow one to enjoy at school. Back in class, they played a fun and engaging game, solving clues based on their current reading book, Into the Volcano. We're so proud of their enthusiasm and teamwork!



Year Three






Year 4 started their new topic in maths this week, looking at length and perimeter. They explored how far a km is using Google Maps and identified how many metres in a kilometre.

Year 5 have been busy honing their building skills this week, practising measuring, cutting, and assembling cams in preparation for their exciting DT project this term. The children will be using their new skills to design and construct a rotating planet model, powered by a cams mechanism.
