It has been a busy last week here at NHP with so much going on!

We want to say a huge thank you to those parents who were able to purchase from our Book Fair. We did get a percentage of the amount raised and we were able to select books for our school. We raised £561 and we were able to spend £224 on books for the school.

Our celebration of Black History drew to a close this week. Year 2 created amazing eBooks which will be shared with parents and year 1 invited parents in to purchase items that their child made – all proceeds went towards the Marcus Rashford Foundation.

The last part of the week, we focused on using technology in the afternoons and staff visited classrooms to get further ideas that they could then implement into their own teaching. On Friday, we finished the week with Headteacher awards assembly. Well done to all those children who received an award, wear your badge with pride!

SAFEGUARDING

This week KS2 had an assembly from Bexley Young Carers. Support services for young carers in Bexley are provided by Imago Young Carers. Being a young carer can have a negative impact on a young person such as low confidence and self-esteem, low educational attendance & attainment and poor physical & mental health.

It is Imago's aim to reduce the negative and highlight the positive impact of being a carer such as increased resilience, empathy, non-judgmental attitude and caring nature.

Imago delivers a support service to anyone aged 8-18 living in Bexley who is taking on caring responsibilities for a family with a long-term illness, disability, mental health or substance misuse issue.

Imago will enable young carers to receive some respite from their caring responsibilities, socialise with their peers and receive tailored support and information. They provide
