

SAFEGUARDING

We are reaching out to discuss a topic of concern regarding the popular Netflix series Squid Game. Although this show has received a lot of attention in the media, it is important to be aware that Squid Game is rated for mature audiences and is not appropriate for children.

The series contains graphic violence, adult themes, and distressing content that is unsuitable for young viewers. Exposure to such material at a young age can negatively impact children's emotional and psychological development. It may also lead to confusion or fear, as children may struggle to distinguish between fictional scenarios and reality.

As a school, we encourage families to monitor the media their children consume and to promote age-appropriate entertainment. Open conversations about what is appropriate for their age group can also help children make better choices as they grow.

If your child mentions or displays behaviours inspired by Squid Game—whether during playtime or discussions—it's important to remind them that such content is not suitable for them. Please do not hesitate to reach out to us if you need advice or support on how to address these concerns at home.




Sign of the Week
