Year 5 had a talk from the school nurse about the changes in their body and how to remain hygienic. The children engaged well with the session and asked lots of relevant questions.

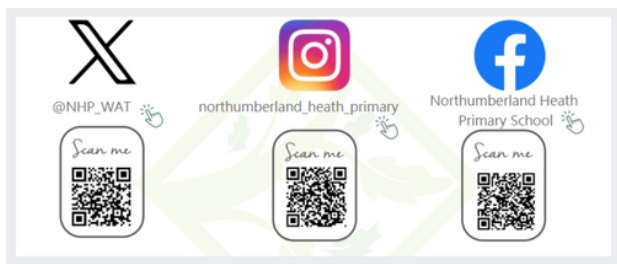
On Thursday, we had Horizons come in and talk to some of our year 6 parents about how to support their child with transition into secondary school. We hope they found this useful.

Are you aware of snus and nicotine pouches

Snus is a kind of oral tobacco containing nicotine. It looks like a small teabag and is taken by placing it between the gums and upper lips. You can't buy snus legally in the UK. Children might have been made aware of snus recently, as some players in men's football have admitted to using snus. Tobacco-free nicotine pouches (usually taken in the same way) have also gained attention in the media.

- Mood swings, frustration, anxiety and paranoia
