



Dear Parents/Carers

I am delighted to update you with plans that are being put in place by the school to benefit our children. One of our observations has been around playtime behaviour and ensuring that everyone has a good experience as well as a smooth transition back to learning. As we have shared previously, the school has invested in more playground equipment and appointed a group of Play Leaders who have been busy supporting across our playgrounds – thank you to them! With that in mind, we have now arranged for a Charlton Athletic coach to be on site for two hours a day, three days a week. The coach will be on hand to continue training our Play Leaders as well as supporting the play that our children engage with at lunchtime. Our coach will be joining the NHP team directly after Easter but will be visiting us next week to begin some training! We look forward to sharing more information about this next term.

Today, I met with PC Ryan who is from the Safer Schools team and she is looking forward to collaborating with us to provide a range of workshops and talks for children, these are in the process of being booked in over the summer term and will include:

- Clever Never Goes workshops regarding stranger danger
- Bullying workshop
- Grooming workshop for Y6 as part of their transition work
- Road Safety with PCSO team
- Choices & Consequences for Y6 as part of their transition work also

All children will be taking part in steel pan drum workshops, tasting food from different cultures, exploring new books which celebrate diversity, and attending an assembly to hear about the Cultural Manifesto for Bexley and gain their feedback and suggestions on how we can support and contribute to this as a whole. We will also be inviting parents/carers/staff family members and friends in to the school to share positives stories on celebrating diversity, equality and inclusion. 
