

YEAR 1

This week in maths, Year 1 have been using manipulatives to find half of an amount and half of an object. The children have been learning how to write half as a fraction and how many equal parts make a whole. Children have been recapping their 2d shapes and finding half of these shapes.



YEAR 4

Fantastic use of manipulatives in Year 4 to demonstrate their learning of decimals and the links that they were able to make to place value. The children were able to see that 1 whole was made of 10 tenths or 100 hundredths. Great job everyone!







YEAR 5

In Year 5, the children have been using Showbie as a part of their work on shape and co-ordinates. This has helped the children to visually see examples of where co-ordinates would be used and use these to solve reasoning and problem-solving questions.

YEAR 6

The children have been sitting their SATs assessments this week – I hope you understand that we cannot take photos of the children completing these!! However, we are all so proud of the children's achievements this week, showing great resilience and determination. Well done Year 6!







Science Y4

In science Y4 have been looking at the effects that sugary drinks can have on our teeth. We put eggs into two containers one containing a cola drink and one just water. We monitored these daily over a week. After a week we took them out and completed our observations. We had noticed that the shell of the cola ones had gone very dark and when cracked open the cola had penetrated the eggs and left brown stains on the inside of the shell. The eggs that were in water seemed unaffected.



In Year 5, we have been on an angle hunt around the school. We took pictures of different objects and used protractors to measure the acute, obtuse and reflex angles. We then marked up the photos on the iPad.







Saplings made bird feeders out of recycled materials. We will hang some in our forest school to help feed the birds and look after our world.



Lisa from the Cyber Crime Unit, Metropolitan Police, will be visiting our school to deliver a presentation to Years 5 and 6. The focus for the talk will be:

- Protecting themselves and passwords
 - Social Media
- What the law says about using computers
 - What is illegal?
 - Developing legal computer skills


