This week the Year 6s had a visitor from Transport for London in order to prepare them as they become more independent and begin to use public transport when they are ready. It was a great afternoon which gave information on safety when using transport and the children were able to ask questions about it and have discussions about it.

Next Wednesday will be our second Positive Noticing Day where children will be encouraged to write positive notes to their peers. Last term's gave us an opportunity to stop, pause and think about each other in a positive way – be that each other's positive traits or behaviours. We hope to see as many of you there as possible as it is a great opportunity to come into school, see our lovely Book Barn and be part of your child's experience in school.


