Dear parents and carers,

Firstly a happy new year to everyone! Just from the first week we have plenty to share with you from all the great things going on around the school.

Following the break, classes have been refocusing on our school rules of Respect, Listen, Ready and 'Fantastic Walking' in order that we can have a really settled start to term with consistent expectations. All classes have 'recognition boards' on which children's great behaviour is acknowledged by gaining recognition points for their behaviour. This, along with the consequences and support children are given, forms a consistent approach throughout the school for children's behaviour.

We continue to encourage children to notice each other's contributions to our school through their behaviour and actions.
